

**Dear Teachers,  
Greetings!**

Kindly take note of the following guidelines while conducting the 1st PTM of the session to ensure a smooth and effective interaction:

- Extend a warm welcome to parents and create a positive, comfortable environment for interaction.
- Inform parents that from this session, CBSE has introduced an integrated **Computational Thinking (CT) and Artificial Intelligence (AI)** curriculum for Classes III to VIII. We are gearing up for implementing CT & AI across subjects such as Mathematics, Science, Computer Science, Languages, and Social Science through logical reasoning questions, puzzles, coding, storytelling, and many more collaborative tasks, for which our teachers are undergoing trainings.
- Share the dates of the Pre-Mid-Term Examination [from 15<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> May] and address any queries related to the syllabus. Printed syllabus booklets will be made available to the students on coming Wednesday.

**Special Instructions:**

- **Class III:** Inform parents that formal assessments will now begin, and examinations will be conducted using question paper-cum-answer sheet booklets.
- **Class V:** Inform parents that assessments will no longer be in booklet form; students will now write their answers in separate test copies.
- For **Classes VI and VII**, brief parents about *Kaushal Bodh (Skill Education)*, a CBSE-mandated component focusing on practical, skill-based learning. Explain how projects and activities will be conducted and assessed.
- Share details about the **DAVCAE Olympiads** for students from Class V onwards, covering ICT, General Science, Mathematics, and English. Inform that registrations will begin in October.
- Inform parents that the school is opting for **Trinity College London Examinations**, including GESE (Graded Examination in Spoken English) and Performing Arts (paid examinations). Highlight that our students achieved Merit and Distinction in GESE during the previous session. Emphasize that these internationally recognized certifications enhance confidence, communication skills, and academic profiles. Note down the names of interested parents for the Orientation Session.
- Advise parents to maintain their child's new uniform properly - clean, well-ironed, so that children adorn a crisp and presentable look.

- Boys to maintain zero cut/army cut of hair, while girls to always wear their hair in two braids.
- Encourage a focus on English communication to improve vocabulary and fluency.
- Remind parents that the vegetable and cutlery schedule has already been shared. Ensure that children bring a proper table mat, plate, spoon, fork, knife, etc., as per the menu.
- Request parents to guide their children to respect teachers and follow school norms, helping them grow into responsible and respectful individuals.

Conclude the meeting on a positive note and thank parents for their cooperation.
